There is a lot of information on the library computers to learn more about the Shaper. Art talked about sand paper, and how we are going through sand paper because people are sanding glued items before they are fully cured or taking too much material on a pass and burning the sand paper from the friction. If you are on a long project, use the erasers on the sand paper in between. Thursdays are maintenance day, shop will close at 3pm every week to get the machines ready for everyone. A Great way to ruin equipment, we had an epoxy project that had rocks in it, it took out 50 teeth - be mindful of what you put through the equipment, the planer will be back up as soon as parts come in.
